History of the Catholic Church (#90) – This denial of the divinity of Christ plunged Alexandria into controversy, and Arius' bishop, Alexander, suspended him. With the unity of the Church at stake, Constantine convoked the first ecumenical council, which met at Nicea in 325. Though the bishops for the most part were men of modest learning, it did not take them long to decide that Arianism was not what they had been teaching and preaching all their lives. The vote against it was virtually unanimous; the divinity of Christ was not to be an open question in the Church. The Creed they issued is, with some additions, still recited and professed at Sunday Mass. It unequivocally condemned Arianism, asserting that the Son was begotten, not created, and was "identical in substance" with the Father (Greek – homoousios). In other words, the Word shared the divine nature and was fully equal with the Father.
