## THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA November 9<sup>th</sup>, 2025

Many Catholics think of St. Peter's Basilica as the pope's main church, but they are wrong. St. John Lateran is the pope's church, the cathedral of the diocese of Rome where the bishop of Rome presides. In 1646 Pope Innocent X commissioned the present structure of St. John Lateran. Beneath its high altar rests the remains of the small wooden table on which, according to tradition, St. Peter celebrated Mass. Unlike the commemorations of other Roman churches, this anniversary is a universal feast. The dedication of a church is a feast for all its parishioners. St. John Lateran is, in a sense, the parish church of all Catholics, for it is the pope's parish, the cathedral church of the bishop of Rome.

<u>History of the Catholic Church</u> (#91) – But peace was not to be had so easily. While the bishops agreed in rejecting Arianism, they were not all happy with the term used to formulate the orthodox position – *homoousios* – which apparently had been imposed on them under the eagle eye of Constantine. So, after the council a controversy began over this term, which lasted until 381, when its use was once more approved and sanctioned at the Council of Constantinople (thus, the use now of the Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed in the universal Church).
