Amos was a great champion of justice. He savagely assailed the oppression of the poor, as well as the judicial system which denied them any hope of obtaining justice. Our short reading is a good example. Here he depicts the greed of the wealthy, who cannot wait for the holy days to be over so that they can get back to making money by dishonest practices. He condemns the separation of worship from the proper treatment of other people, especially the poor. The Bible doesn't always give us examples to be imitated. At times it gives us examples to be learned from painfully. The servant in Jesus' story is one of these, brought forward to teach Christians the wise use of money. Here Jesus stresses the impossibility of any compromise between God and mammon. For St. Luke, to use money wisely is to give it to the poor, and thus ensure one's eternal salvation.

This faith in Jesus they expressed especially in the various titles they attributed to Him, such as Messiah or Christ, Son of God, Savior, Lord. This last term, Lord, is especially significant, for it denoted their devotion to Him and recognition of His royal sovereignty — a sovereignty that they recognized when they worshipped Jesus in their liturgy and invoke Him as their Lord.
