DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY April 27th, 2025

In the Gospel we have St. John's version of Pentecost, the official birthday of the Church. The Risen Lord appears to His Apostles, showing them His wounds and bestowing peace on them. He gives them the gift of the Spirit and inaugurates the mission of the Church, which is the continuance of His own mission. One of the effects of the gift of the Spirit was that the Church had the power to forgive sins. Thomas' profession of faith: "My Lord and my God" is the supreme Christological statement of St. John's Gospel. Originally John's Gospel ended where today's passage ends. For this and the next five Sundays the Second Reading is taken from the Book of Revelation. The Book is the revelation of Jesus Christ, made known through an angel to an unidentified prophet, John. It describes the battle between good and evil, and assures believers that good (God!) will triumph. It was addressed to the whole Church and was meant to be read at liturgical assemblies to encourage believers to hold fast to the faith in time of persecution.

History of the Catholic Church (#72) – Church architecture came into being, Constantine being a prime mover in this regard. As Christianity flourished under his protection, simple, spacious buildings were no longer sufficient; they had to be "splendid, public and imposing" as well. Here as in their other artistic endeavours at the time, the Christians were receptive rather than creative. As models they had at hand the various Roman basilicas or assembly halls of different shapes and sizes. The imperial audience hall, with its apse to accommodate the throne of the Emperor, proved to be most suitable for adaptation to liturgical purposes. Constantine himself set the pace, erecting many churches such as the great Roman basilica over the spot where St. Peter's bones were thought to rest; like many of his structures it combined the basilica-type church with a large forecourt or atrium.
