The reading from Acts shows that St. Paul's policy was to preach to the Jews first, because they were the chosen people. But when they reject his message, he turns to the Gentiles. In this way the prophecy that the light of salvation would reach the ends of the earth was fulfilled. Jesus is the True Shepherd, and will not allow anyone to snatch from His care the sheep that belong to Him. (Gospel Reading) He will give them eternal life. What does belonging to Him entail? It entails listening to His voice and following Him.

History of the Catholic Church (#74) – Belief in the real presence of Jesus – Body and Blood – under the form of bread and wine continued to animate the faithful at Mass (as it was called from the 5th century on). No orthodox spokesman of the early Church, in fact, ever subscribed to a mere symbolic interpretation of the rite. But there was as yet no official formulation to describe the nature of the change that took (takes) place in the bread and wine. This only happened in the Middle Ages, with the definition of the tenet of transubstantiation.
