THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT December 14th, 2025

Isaiah uses the image of the desert, made fertile by rain, to portray the confident hope that God would restore His people, crushed by misfortune. Their most crippling disabilities – blindness, deafness and lameness – will be relieved when God sends salvation to His people. John the Baptist's image of the Messiah was that of a stern judge who would execute a fiery judgment. But Jesus did not fit this image. Hence, John's doubts about Him. Jesus dispelled John's doubts by showing that He was doing precisely the kind of things that had been predicted for the messianic times (by prophets such as Isaiah). Once again, St. Matthew sees Jesus as the One who fulfills the messianic prophecies. James is talking about the Second Coming of Jesus. He urges the kind of patience and hope farmers show in waiting for the harvest, and which the prophets of old showed as they waited for the promises to be fulfilled.

History of the Catholic Church (#96) – In the meantime, theological reflection on the nature of the Holy Spirt was stimulated by the whole controversy. Here also St. Athanasius' contribution was decisive: the Spirt, he asserted, was consubstantial with Father and Son. His work was completed by the Cappadocian Fathers Basil the Great (d. 379), Gregory of Nazianzus (d. 389), and Gregory of Nyssa (d. 395). The difficult problem of how the Spirit was distinct from Father and Son while sharing the same essence was solved by differentiating between their modes of origins; the Son is generated, but the Spirt proceeds. Unity was then restored to the Church at the Counsil of Constantinople in 381, which reaffirmed the Nicene faith and endorsed the consubstantiality of the Spirit, thus giving the doctrine of the Trinity its definitive form.
