TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME October 12th, 2025

The First Reading tells of how, on being cured of leprosy, Naaman acknowledges Yahweh as the supreme and only God. However, when he tries to express his gratitude to Elisha, the prophet refuses to accept it, because it would suggest that the cure was due to him rather than to God. As commander of the Syrian army, Naaman was a Gentile. This story prepares us for the Gospel account of the cure of ten lepers by Jesus, and of how only one of them, a foreigner (a Samaritan, so also a Gentile), came back to thank Him. The stranger puts the Jews to shame. His reaction anticipates the glad reception of the Good News by the Samaritans in Acts 8:1-25.

<u>History of the Catholic Church (#87)</u> – This concept of the pre-existent Word when applied to Christ made it possible to distinguish in the eternal Godhead between God the Creator and the Word, His agent in creating. As Word He was the principle of rationality in God and also the principle of revelation; and as Word He had become incarnate in Christ. The concept of the Word also helped to clarify the meaning of the scriptural term "Son of God"; in this sense it meant not only the historical person of Christ but also His pre-existent being.
