## THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER April 14<sup>th</sup>, 2024

In the First Reading Peter shows great courage when he confronts the people with their part in the death of Jesus. However, he goes on to excuse them on the grounds that they acted in ignorance. In this way he may have been inspired by the dying prayer of Jesus: "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." He urges them to repent, assuring them that if they do, their sins fill be forgiven. In the Gospel St. Luke's primary interest is to show that the Risen Lord is the same person the Apostles had known prior to the crucifixion. He emphasises the reality of Jesus' bodily resurrection, it makes it clear that the resurrection is not a return to earthly life – Jesus has risen to a new life beyond death. It was only by combining various passages from the prophets that the early Christians came to accept the idea that a suffering Messiah was part of God's plan of salvation. So St. Luke has the risen Lord showing the Apostles how the Scriptures had foretold that the Christ would suffer and so enter into His glory. Jesus also gives them a mission – the proclamation of repentance and forgiveness of sins.
