Today's Gospel tells us about the discovery of the empty tomb. The empty tomb (with the discarded linen cloths) in itself is not the ultimate and direct proof of the resurrection. Nevertheless, it was the first step towards establishing the truth that Jesus had escaped the bonds of death, and it prepared His disciples to encounter the risen Lord. Many of the readings of the Easter cycle were meant to instruct the newly baptised on the Christian way of life. Today's Second Reading and its alternative are good examples. Thus the Easter season provides us with an opportunity to reflect on what it means to be baptised members of Christ's Body. The Lord is risen! Happy Easter!

History of the Catholic Church (#71) – In their attitude toward worship as in other respects, Christians stood apart from the pagan world. They had no special places or temples; or in in the words of Minucius Felix: "We have no shrines or altars." As St. Paul told them: "You are the temple of the living God." The place where they worshiped had no particular importance in itself – it was usually just a large room in one of the member's homes; the whole focus was on the worshipping and praying community itself. But as time passed and as their numbers grew, larger, spacious buildings took the place of the simple rooms. The Eucharist was no longer consecrated on a simple table but on a massive and ornate altar made of precious marbles and studded with gems.
