FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME January 28th, 2024

Here St. Mark begins to tell us the kind of things Jesus did in proclaiming the kingdom. Deuteronomy presents Moses as the ideal prophet (First Reading). The prophet can never speak on his own authority, but speaks on behalf of God. The Jews believed that God would raise up in the last days a prophet like Moses. The early Christians regarded Jesus as the awaited prophet. His teaching was given with authority and confirmed by miracles, the sign that God was with Him. In today's Gospel we see how Jesus spoke with authority, and how the ordinary people recognised this.
