## SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME February 4<sup>th</sup>, 2024

Leprosy is the clear theme of the First Reading and the Gospel. In biblical times lepers were treated as pariahs. Leprosy was the ultimate uncleanliness. It made the victim an outcast not only socially, but also in the religious sphere. Jesus broke through all the religious and social taboos and reached out a loving and healing hand to the leper. In this way we see how a Christian community should deal with sinners and people society rejects. Besides, a Christian is one who has been "cleansed" by Christ in baptism, and who ought to spread the Good News! In the Gospel we have an early instance of what scholars call St. Mark's "Messianic Secret," whereby Jesus seems to hide His identity as the Messiah and Son of God until it is made apparent after His death and resurrection.

<u>History of the Catholic Church (#20)</u> – Third, it was spiritually a time of extraordinary unrest. In spite of increasing prosperity and the possibilities of enhanced enjoyment in the cities where theaters, stadia, amphitheatres, and baths provided a constant source of amusement for the inhabitants, there was a growing spiritual hunger. The rapid social change accompanying progress unsettled many minds, while the political climate was most depressing. The loss of political freedom was bad enough, but the successors of Augustus were themselves a strange lot. Tiberius, Gaius, Caligula, Claudius, and Nero were Emperors whose personal lives were darkened by bizarre, macabre incidents and crimes. The atmosphere of their courts was heavy with intrigue and foul suspicion (more about their personal lives next week).
