## TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023

The parable of the two sons was addressed to the chief priests and elders of the people. Its purpose was to defend Jesus' invitation of sinners and outcasts to the Kingdom, in the face of the sneers of the religious establishment. The parable outraged the religious people. The first son represents sinners. Like him they originally chose to go their own way but then repented and took God's way, and so gained entry into the Kingdom. The second son represents the chief priests and elders. Like him they promised to work for God but failed to do so, and so have excluded themselves from the Kingdom. Repentance is a necessary disposition for entry into the Kingdom. The theme of sin and repentance is also dealt with in the First Reading. The parable also echoes a favourite theme of St. Matthew: the split in the religious person between saying and doing. Hence, its relevance for "religious" people in every age.

## MASS SCHEDULE

**History of the Catholic Church** (#4) – this, at first, small community of believers at Jerusalem was led by twelve men who were chosen by Jesus Himself during His lifetime and were later named Apostles. Their leader and spokesman, according to the Acts of the Apostles, was Peter (or, in Greek, Cephas). According to St. Paul, Peter was the first to see the risen Jesus, while Acts pictures him as the apostle who preaches the first sermon and works the first miracle. Two others who stand out at this period were John, who is closely associated with Peter in Acts, and James, who apparently succeeded Peter as leader of the Jerusalem community after Peter departed to do missionary work. The story of how this tiny community of believers spread to many cities of the Roman Empire within less than a century is indeed a remarkable chapter in the history of humanity. In attempting to trace it here we must realize that our sources are limited and that we must tolerate many gaps in our information.
